These are challenging times for everyone, but we want you to know that things are going well with AGAPE of NC. We are here to continue our mission of serving children, youth and families in North Carolina!

Over the past few years, you have heard us talk about "going paperless." Well, gaining experience with those electronic capabilities is serving us well in these days of "social distancing." Actually, we prefer the term "physical distancing" because embracing technology has allowed AGAPE to remain socially, as well as spiritually, connected to our AGAPE families and you!

Besides phone calls, we are able to email, Facebook, Tweet, Instagram, and hold "virtual" meetings via several different types of video-calling and/or internet web-conferencing applications. When this season of distancing and quarantining started, we had families in the middle of training to become licensed foster parents, as well as licensed foster parents who need continuing education credits to maintain their licenses. In both situations, going digital has allowed AGAPE to continue providing online training to all of them!

We have already scheduled monthly stipends to AGAPE families with children or youth in

their homes for timely delivery in April. Essential medical and mental health care will continue so long as providers remain available. As other needs may be identified, we will do what we can to offer additional support to those AGAPE families and the kids in their care.

Unfortunately, children and youth in need of fostering did not go away just because our society is experiencing the corona virus pandemic. Sadly, some experts predict that more foster placements may become necessary soon as families suffer the strains of illness, job loss, closed schools, other interrupted services, and simply being confined.

YOUNG ADULT FOSTER HOME HIGHLIGHTS!

Enjoy this list of some of the "milestones" experienced by residents of AGAPE's Young Adult Foster Homes in Raleigh and Wilmington. Some of these "gifts" were given by foster parents, mentors, case workers and others -- some (we're proud to say) have been accomplished by the young people for themselves!

Aptitudes & Competencies:

- ~Cooking and cleaning skills.
- ~Time-management techniques.
- ~How to share and cooperate, taking on responsibilities that impact, not just self, but others.



- ~Meeting with counselors about options to complete and/or further his/her education.
- ~Going back to high school as an older student when he/she was previously held back or dropped out. (This can be challenging when age, experience and/or level of maturity do not match.)
- ~Taking classes online or attending a different school.
- ~Achieving passing grades and getting promoted to the next level, including graduation from high school or obtaining a GED certificate.
- ~Applying and enrolling at a community college, or other school, to study a trade or take courses towards a college degree.

Employment:

~Filling out applications and interviewing for employment.

Personal Transportation:

- ~Learning to call Uber and becoming comfortable to ride alone.
- ~Taking Drivers Education in school or by private lessons.
- ~Dreaming of owning and maintaining a car; saving money towards that goal.

Entertainment:

- ~Getting dressed up and going to Prom.
- ~Taking a group trip to
- a large amusement park, including a Christian music concert.
- ~Going to the movies and enjoying a live theatre performance together.

Service to Others:

- ~Helping a foster parent who's providing respite care for other foster families.
- ~Volunteering weekly at the Library and earning good reports from the Library Staff.

Self-Improvement:

~Gaining confidence in self; making good eye contact and holding conversations with others-both inside & outside of the foster home.



- ~Participating in group sessions held in the foster home -- and opening up in peer group support sessions outside of the foster home.
- ~Making and hanging out with new friends from the foster home, school, work, church, etc.
- ~Continuing professional therapy to manage trigged by issues from his/her past.
- ~Restoring certain family relationships.
- ~Being offered access to various foster care resource programs and opportunities to attend youth empowerment conferences.

Transitioning to Independent Living: ~Leasing and moving into his/her own apartment, while maintaining relationships with foster parents, mentors, case workers, and other young adult residents from AGAPE's Young Adult Foster Homes.

DIRECTOR'S UPDATE

Thank you again for another amazing year to Live Jesus & Give Jesus. AGAPE of NC continues to be blessed to serve in the ministry of loving children and families in our community. Unfortunately, the struggle to provide loving, Christian foster homes is still a monumental necessity.

In 2019, we were able to provide an average of 25 children each month with a loving home. We provided management, guidance, support and education to 47 foster families. We were able to license 15 new foster homes and managed to squeak in 4 adoptions before the end of the year.

AGAPE recognizes it is essential to continue raising awareness about the needs of our

foster care system. During the year, we doubled our reach to Facebook followers; upped our Twitter reach by 40%; increased our reach on Instagram by 70%, and we continue to have a strong following on the AGAPE website.

In conclusion, let's talk about finances. AGAPE provided \$423,000 in foster care and adoption services and raised \$214,000 in funds from our generous donors. We also raised \$97,000 during our 4th Annual Change for Life campaign.

Let us remember that what God gives us by his grace is His gift to us. How we live our lives is our gift to God. Thank you for Living Jesus & Giving Jesus.
