IN MEMORIAM: JACK R. BAKER

For many years, Jack Baker was a tremendous supporter for AGAPE of North Carolina. We are grateful for this opportunity to share a little about him now.

Son of the late Rudolph Jackson and Edna Carpenter Baker, Jack was born in Durham, NC on April 18, 1946. He graduated from Durham High School in 1964 and from UNC-Chapel Hill in 1967. Having obtained his MS degree in Chemical Engineering, Jack made that field his lifelong profession. His major interests were the Lord, his family, travel, hiking in the woods, and genealogy. Most recently, Jack lived in Charlotte, NC and worshipped with the Archdale Church of Christ.

Last January, at the age of 73, Jack graduated to Glory. He passed away of melanoma at the Charlotte home of his sister and brother-in-law, Dr. Betty Baker Reiter & Dr. Harold B. Reiter (both mathematics professors). Jack's family arranged for his earthly remains to be returned to Durham for burial in Maplewood Cemetery. (Duke Hospital and Duke University's West Campus now occupy land that once belonged to Jack's ancestors. His great-great grandparents, Jesse & Mary Rigsbee, and several descendants are buried in the privately-owned and preserved <u>T.J. Rigsbee Family</u> <u>Graveyard</u> located near Wallace Wade Stadium.)

Although Jack never married or had children of his own, he was a loving uncle (the photo here is from his niece's wedding in 2001) and was generously kind to others. He was known to be a gentleman -- very pleasant and well-liked. We are told that Jack never owned a home, always choosing to live in a modest, but sufficient, apartment. He drove modest cars "until they wore out" (according to his family) before he would get another one. Jack's family also shared that he enthusiastically enjoyed bargains and couponing. All this sounds in keeping with his frugal (yet not stingy) nature.

You see, Jack saved and planned. Throughout his life – and even at his death – Jack served God, giving of his resources first to further the Lord's work and help others. Jack's sister added that he earnestly looked for opportunities to support causes in which he believed.

As Jack big-heartedly gave to AGAPE of North Carolina throughout the years, he expressed his appreciation for the significance of our mission to provide stable, loving, Christian homes for children and youth in need. Jack even honored AGAPE with a generous bequest from his estate to continue his legacy of caring for others as Jesus cared for us.



At this time of loss, we extend our condolences to Jack's family and friends. He is, and will continue to be, missed. May we all be comforted in knowing that Jack Baker was a quiet giver, asking nothing in return - choosing instead to lay up his treasures in Heaven.

In her free time, Daniela enjoys cooking, taking walks with her dog, and attending her daughter's soccer games.


BLOOM BAGS! By Staci Stepp
