

RECAP OF 2020

Thank you again for another amazing year of sharing Gods love in spite of a worldwide pandemic.

AGAPE of NC continues to be blessed to serve in the ministry of loving children and families in our community. The struggle to provide loving Christian foster homes is still a monumental necessity.

In 2020, we were able to provide an average of 24 children each month with a loving Christian home. We provided management, guidance, support, and education to 58 foster families. We were able to license 11 new foster homes and completed an adoption.

In conclusion, let's talk about finances.
AGAPE provided \$415,000 in foster care
and adoption services and received
\$345,000 in recurring donations from our
generous supporters. We also raised
\$208,808 during our 5th Annual Change
for Life giving campaign.

Let's remember that what God gives us by His grace is His gift to us. How we live our lives is our gift to God.

SAMUEL'S STORY ... UPDATED

SAMUEL'S 2020 STORY

Last Fall, we introduced Samuel, a little boy diagnosed with neuroblastoma back in October 2019. We told about little Sam's year of hospitalizations and treatments (with 2020's COVID-19 restrictions and protocols further complicating his situation). We also shared the journey that brought Sam (who first entered the foster care system when he was only 18 months old) into AGAPE's sphere, eventually being fostered by an exceptional couple with faith that God would prepare and equip them to meet the needs of this precious little tyke.

For those of you who read or heard Samuel's story last October (or since) and might be wondering how he is doing now . . .

Little Sam is doing quite well and thriving in the care of Luke & Deborah! He is currently cancer-free . . . although still not fully out of the woods.

A round of treatments administered in November and December of last year did not go as everyone had wished. Sam had another severe pain reaction and was unable to complete that therapy.

Even so, he is continuing a regimen of special medications over the next four months to, hopefully, decrease chances of the cancer returning. The little guy's team of doctors will re-evaluate his condition at the end of that four-month period to decide what the next course of action may be. Deborah and Luke are prepared to consider additional treatment options, if recommended, because they want Sam "to have the very best opportunity for a long and happy life."

Meanwhile, Sam continues to improve, and he has the temperament of a normal 2 ½ year-old! He loves to play, sing, and prepare pretend meals in a toy kitchen. He is walking and going up stairs unassisted. Luke and Deborah are grateful to have a wonderful nanny, Anna, who now comes to their home during the week to help care for Sam -- this extraordinary little boy who remains special in his spirit.


Regardless of all his medical challenges, Sam seems to know he is cherished. He is living the life of a happy, energetic toddler and still tells everyone he sees, "I love you!"
