AGAPE OF NC IS REACHING OUT!

In our last Newsletter, we introduced the newest members of AGAPE's Outreach Team -- Leah Hayes, Foster Parent Recruiter and Joe Hall, Church Outreach Liaison. Leah and Joe work closely with AGAPE's Director of Administration and Outreach, Nicole Spickard, and our Executive Director, Kimberly Scott.

Now, we want to let you know a little more about what this **amazing Outreach Team** is doing for AGAPE. Together, they are responsible for making in-person visits with churches and community partners, participating in foster care & adoption events, and attending other meetings or public gatherings where they can provide information about becoming a Foster/Adoptive Parent or Volunteer and raise awareness about AGAPE's mission to help Christians answer that call.

Leah, a former educator, and mother to son, Elijah, is currently a graduate student working on her master's degree. She will "walk the stage" in the Spring of 2023.

On behalf of AGAPE, Leah visits community locations and leaders, following up on referrals to further enhance our agency's community relationships. Her AGAPE work includes participating in the development and implementation of Foster Parent retention programs, while creating and designing new campaigns, as needed, to continuously attract new Foster Families.

Sometimes Leah and Nicole present at events dedicated to AGAPE. On other occasions, they represent AGAPE in a joint setting with several agencies from the surrounding area. These group venues allow Leah and Nicole to connect and network with other professionals regarding resources and resolving issues in common. Any opportunity is an excellent time for them to answer questions, offer insights, and share AGAPE's distinguishing attributes with prospective Foster/ Adoptive Parents or potential Respite Care Providers (another critical need) and other Volunteers.

Leah especially enjoys getting out into the community and would love to speak with YOU -- not just about AGAPE and how to become a Foster Family -- but also how you can Volunteer your time to aid AGAPE's mission. Both roles are vital to make a difference in the lives of children and families. Just let Leah know about any event or occasion where she can tell prospective Foster & Adoptive Parents how AGAPE may help them on their journey and/or recruit and guide supportive Volunteers! Joe retired as a Lt. Col. following 20 years of service in the US Air Force Medical Services Corps. Joe and Cathy, his wife of 38 years, fostered children in four different states while serving in the military and they adopted four siblings from foster care. Their family currently consists of six kids and six grandchildren. For the last 14 years, Joe guided high school students as an Air Force JROTC Senior Aerospace Science Instructor. He also served on AGAPE's Board (as Board Chair or Vice Chair) for 8 years.

Having now retired from teaching, today Joe's work with AGAPE focuses primarily on outreach to congregations of the Church. In that role, Joe travels to churches to provide updates on AGAPE and to educate them on the continuing need for Foster Parents. (Because Joe also serves as a Guardian ad Litem volunteer for the Department of Social Services, he can tell interested groups or individuals about that program, as well.) Joe is available to provide sermons, Bible classes, or presentations during a worship service, potluck fellowship, ladies day event, small/connect group gathering, or other type of church meeting.

Joe is very interested in talking with church leaders and coming to visit any congregation that extends an invitation, welcoming YOUR assistance to share AGAPE's story and encourage more Christians to become licensed Foster Parents. Just let him know whenever your congregation is ready for an AGAPE information session!



SIGNS OF TRAUMA BY AGE



Ages 0-5

- Irritability, "fussiness", clinginess
- Startling easily or being difficult to calm, frequent tantrums
- Delays in reaching physical, language, or other milestones

Ages 6-12

- Difficulty paying attention
- · Being quiet or withdrawn, isolated
- Fighting with peers or adults
- Changes in school performance and behavior

Ages 13-18

- Talking about the trauma constantly, or denying that it happened
- Difiance
- Risky/Illegal behaviors, fighting, drug or alcohol use, running away
