



REBEKAH RUCKER
Behavior Technician

Rebekah Rucker began working with Agape in January 2023 and says she is "so thrilled to be joining the Agape team!" A few of Rebekah's favorite things are animals, cooking, traveling new places, painting, and being the mother of five children.

In 2010, Rebekah and her husband, had a 7-year-old daughter and two sons, aged 4 and 2. Rebekah writes that she "experienced the Lord's unmistakable voice and I couldn't let go of the sense that He was asking us to become foster parents. Though it felt crazy, we got licensed and accepted special need, newborn twin boys in December 2011." This turned out to be a permanent decision as those boys became "forever family" in 2014.

Rebekah adds that because of their adopted sons' disabilities, **"I have spent the last decade researching and attending every therapy, attachment, and counseling session I could access in hopes of improving the boys' chances at a beautiful future. The pool of knowledge is vast, but I have learned so much about child development, behavior, connection, attachment, trauma, and intellectual disabilities along the way."** Rebekah also recently became certified to work as a registered behavior technician in the field of applied behavior analysis. This certification allows her to work at an Applied Behavior Analysis center under the supervision of a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst.

Rebekah says she chose to work with Agape "because I believe very few things are more important than caring for the most vulnerable among us, children made in God's image. Though it hasn't been easy, and I feel like I've lived out an extended treasure hunt for resources and information, I would foster and adopt my boys again a thousand times. I am honored to work with Agape, encouraging families, spreading the message and eternal value of caring for children who need a safe space to exist in this broken world."

IN JANUARY 2023, AL SIMMONS BEGAN SERVING AS A NEW AGAPE OF NORTH CAROLINA BOARD MEMBER!

Al has been preaching the gospel for more than 38 years. He has served as the minister at Highland Acres Church of Christ in Statesville, N.C., for over 28 years, and he also shepherds the congregation as an Elder.

Al graduated from the East Tennessee School of Preaching and Missions ("ETSOPM" which is now known as the Southeastern Institute of Biblical Studies) in Knoxville, Tennessee. He served as an instructor and Dean of Students at ETSOPM from 1992 until 1994. WRAP-AROUND CARE VOLUNTEER PROGRAM!

The beauty of AGAPE of North Carolina is that we are an agency focused on the entire aspect of family. **We are built on the foundation of unconditional love, and we mimic the love that God shows to each one of us.** Without our foster families, we would not be able to accomplish our mission or purpose.

While AGAPE is dedicated to our mission of recruitment and licensing, we also **value the work of our volunteers who share our same love and passion.** Foster care does not just begin and end with our children, but it extends to parents, grandparents, siblings, and all those who are in the lives of these children. It is a goal of ours to minister and connect with those involved in the child's life. The old and familiar proverb is, **"It takes a village to raise a child."** With our volunteers' help, we can reach out to

each child's village and allow them to feel the love of Jesus by letting them know they are not alone in this journey.

We know that the journey of a foster parent and family can often be tumultuous, unknown, and sometimes isolating. **With the help of our volunteers, we can not only reach out to the foster child in the home, but we can touch the parents --** and the biological children, as well, who have also taken on the task of opening their hearts, homes, and sharing their parents.

Many believe that if they, themselves, cannot open their homes to a foster child, there is nothing they can do. That simply is not true. There are many ways our volunteers can get involved without necessarily taking on the role of a foster parent.

HERE ARE SOME WAYS OUR VOLUNTEERS ARE GETTING INSPIRED TO HELP

BECOMING A RESPITE PROVIDER

What is respite care?

Respite is providing parents and other caregivers with short-term childcare services that offer temporary relief, improve family stability, and reduce the risk of abuse or neglect.

Respite can be planned or offered during emergencies or times of crisis. Respite can be an hour or an overnight. You do not have to be licensed to be a respite provider.

DONATING SUPPLIES

Often children in foster care do not have much to call their own. Donating supplies is a great way to let them know they are being thought of. Items such as toiletries, crayons, and activity books, reading material, back to school supplies, or even a stuffed animal and blanket that they can call theirs! Many times children are taken late in the night and have to sleep somewhere foreign right after experiencing the trauma of being removed. A soft blanket and stuffed animal are great ways to offer comfort.

MAILING CARDS

This is my favorite because it does not need to involve a lot of money and it is a way to reach out in a simple, yet heartfelt, gesture of love. These can be birthday cards for the foster and biological children in the home. Birthday or anniversary cards for the caregivers in the home. They can be homemade too -- which adds just the right amount of extra love. Cards and notes can also be sent at any time just to check in and let a person know, "We are thinking about You, and We are praying for You. You are not alone."

GIFT CARDS

This is also a great way to send help to a family.

We like to encourage gift cards from merchants, like Target or Walmart, that can provide options of relief for a family such as food, clothing, diapers or formula, books, or recreational supplies for the children.

Gas cards are helpful too, as parents tote their children to school, therapy sessions, extracurricular activities, etc. and this expense adds up.

SPREADING THE WORD

We cannot do it without you. If you know others who are interested in volunteering their time, we encourage our volunteers to share what they are doing with others. By sharing their joy and testimony we can spread the word and extend the invite to others who may want to give back.



At the end February, Leah had the opportunity to go to Brunswick Church of Christ and present to the Ladies Labor of Love group. Leah commented that, **“These women are passionate about volunteering for AGAPE. We had a wonderful afternoon of fellowship and we have been able to collaborate outreach to some of our AGAPE families!”**


